

It's not just a suggestion, it's the law.



Keep pesticides in a locked cabinet, out of reach (and sight!) of children.

<u>Never</u> transfer pesticides to food or drink containers. If you use a secondary container, make sure it is properly labeled.





Read the label before applying any pesticides. Many pesticide products have directions for how long children and pets must stay out of the treated area.

Make sure any people your child visits, like friends and family members, know to keep household pesticides out of reach.





Use IPM principles in your home. Try lower-risk non-chemical techniques first. If pesticides are necessary, reduce the risk of exposure by buying, using, and storing only as much pesticide as you need.

## What is a pesticide?

A pesticide is any substance that controls, destroys, repels, or attracts a pest.

Common household pesticides include:

Weed Killer
Kitchen and Bath Disinfectants
Insecticide Sprays
Insect Repellents
Mildew Removers
Rat Poison
Flea and Tick Shampoo
