NOTICE OF COMPLETION OF COMPREHENSIVE RISK ASSESSMENT FOR THE ACTIVE INGREDIENT **CHLOROPICRIN**

The Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) has completed a comprehensive risk assessment for the active ingredient chloropicrin. DPR previously conducted a risk assessment evaluating public airborne exposure to chloropicrin under the legislative mandate of the California Toxic Air Contaminant (TAC) Act. The risk management directive (RMD) addressing resident and bystander exposures identified by the TAC evaluation is available at http://www.cdpr.ca.gov/docs/emon/pubs/chloropicrin/directive.pdf.

The purpose of this comprehensive risk assessment is to evaluate potential human health risks to both workers and the general public from all chloropicrin exposure scenarios. The final comprehensive risk characterization document (RCD) and exposure assessment document (EAD) for chloropicrin are available at http://www.cdpr.ca.gov/docs/risk/rcd.htm.

DPR will issue an RMD to address any unacceptable occupational exposures identified by the final comprehensive risk assessment. When a final draft of the RMD becomes available, a public notice with a link to the RMD will be issued and posted on DPR's Web site at http://www.cdpr.ca.gov/docs/registration/canot/camenu.htm.

Since new uses or discoveries concerning the active ingredient may change the risk potential at any time, the RCD and EAD may be subject to revisions in the future to account for any new information or data that DPR determines will impact the risk assessment.
