Licensing Program Fee History

Historically -

- Fees set by the Legislature
- Most fees were established in 1967
- Fees raised by CA Food and Agricultural Code amendments in 1970s & 1980s
- Licensing Program only partially supported by fee revenue
 Example Fee History, Pest Control Business (PCB) License
 1984: \$25.00; 1987: \$100.00

SB 1049 (2003, Ch. 741) – Licensing Fees Must Fully Support Program

Legislative mandate that licensing program is self-supported

- CA Food and Agricultural Code (FAC) Sec. 11502.5(b)-(g)
 - Directed the Department to set licensing and certification fees
 - Fees set to support total annual costs of program
- Resulted in first and only time the Department adjusted fees to fully support program (example: PCB raised from \$100 to \$160)


Licensing & Certification Revenue Sources

Four general sources

- Renewals ~ 67%
- New Applications & Exams ~ 29%
- Continuing Education (CE) Course Applications ~ 2.5 %
- Late Fees ~ 1.5%

Fees from renewals and new applications fund the program


Decline In Licensed Applicators And Businesses




3% annual decline

 - Businesses (- 5%)




Licensing Revenue 19% Drop From 2016/17-2023/24




Licensing Program Expenditures 2016-2024


* Estimated expenditures for 2023-24



Licensing Enhancements, 2018-19 to 2019-20




Licensing Enhancements, 2020-21 to 2021-22




Licensing Enhancements, 2022-23 to 2023-24




Expenditures-Licensing 脳 2023-23 BCP General Fund Expenditures 📷 2024-25 BCP Expenditures — Revenue

Future Licensing Projections – 2024-25 BCP Support


Estimated Future Revenues and Expenditures

Fee Funding Proposal

To meet future projected expenditures

Renewal, New Application, Exam Costs

- Ongoing program costs = 2.0 X current costs
- Ongoing costs + 2024-25 BCP = additional 0.4 X
 Pesticide Broker License increased from \$0 to \$20
 Continuing Education fee unchanged

Licensing Program Trajectory

- Develop and implement three renewal cycle after fee increase
- Work towards having electronic payment and online submittal of licensing applications.
- Increase Spanish language study guides and certification exams
- Further develop continuing education tracking and reporting abilities for license holders
