EUP Application Requirements:

- Objective/purpose of testing
- Pests involved
- Use sites/commodities involved
 - Crops, trees, ornamental plants, animals, structures, fallow land etc.
- Application rates
- Size and location of test sites
- Testing dates
- Test supervision
- Cooperator information
- Product toxicity data
- Handling procedures

Research Authorizations

RA Application Information Requirements:

- Researcher affiliation
- Products involved
 - Active ingredient toxicity data
 - Product formulation type
- Maximum application rates
- Methods of application
- Total area of trials
 - Number of distinct trials
- Commodities involved
 - Stage of growth for crops
- Types of data to be collected
- First and last pesticide application dates

RAs vs. EUPs

Research Authorization

- Not a registration, CA only
- No application fee
- Site-specific requirements may be imposed
- Research conducted entirely on registrantowned land is exempt
- Only pesticide use data must be reported
- County Ag Commissioner must be notified

Experimental Use Permit

- Federal + state registration required
- All registration fees apply
- Timeline matches registration process
- Research conducted on less than ten acres of land is exempt
- All collected data must be reported

Both RAs and EUPs:

- FIFRA 25b materials and research conducted entirely in greenhouses or laboratories used exclusively for research purposes are exempt
- Usually effective for one year
