## SECOND REVISED NOTICE OF PROPOSED EMERGENCY ACTION

## **REGISTRATION FEES**

The Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) proposes to amend sections 6170, 6170.5 and 6216 of Title 3, California Code of Regulations relating to registration fees. DPR also proposes to amend the Application for Pesticide Registration DPR-REG-030 (Rev. 10/15). This application form, incorporated by reference in section 6170, will be revised to reflect the new renewal fee as well as nonsubstantive clarifying and editorial changes. Attached to this Notice is the specific regulatory language of DPR's proposed emergency action and Application for Pesticide Registration, and the Finding of Emergency. Government Code section 11346.1(a)(2) requires that, at least five working days prior to submission of the proposed emergency action to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), the adopting agency provide a notice of the proposed emergency action to every person who has filed a request for notice of regulatory action with the agency. After submission of the proposed emergency to OAL, OAL shall allow interested persons five calendar days to submit comments on the proposed emergency regulations as set forth in Government Code section 11349.6. Any interested person may submit comments in writing relevant to the proposed emergency action via U.S. mail, e-mail, or facsimile. Written comments must be received at OAL and at DPR simultaneously, within five calendar days after DPR submits the emergency regulation to OAL for review. Please address comments to:

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DPR intends to submit this proposed emergency action for review on September 15, 2021, at which time a five-day public comment period will begin that closes on September 20, 2021. Upon filing, OAL will have ten calendar days within which to review and make a decision on the proposed emergency rule. If approved, OAL will file the regulations with the Secretary of State, and the emergency regulations will become effective on October 1, 2021.
